

FREE SCHOOL MEAL ELIGIBILITY - COULD YOUR CHILD QUALIFY?



Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a school meal free of charge under the Universal Infant Free School Scheme. However if you are in receipt of certain benefits then your child in any year group, might also be eligible for Free School Meals. If this is this case then this could bring very valuable funding which your child and our school could benefit from.

If you've ever been 'tongue-tied', 'hoodwinked' or 'in a pickle', if you've insisted on 'fair play', 'slept not one wink', 'laughed yourself into stitches' or even had 'too much of a good thing', you've got Will to thank for that. If you believe 'the game is up and the truth will come out', refer to your own 'flesh and blood' or can acknowledge an 'eyesore' or a 'laughing stock' then by Jove! Tut Tut! What the dickens! You've been quoting Shakespeare to your children all along!

Shakespeare has certainly shaped our language and his characters and themes seem as relevant today as they did 400 years ago, just look at all the adaptations of his plays. I'm sure you'd gathered Gnomeo and Juliet were following a certain theme but did you know The Lion King is based on Hamlet and the Lion King 2 on Romeo and Juliet?

Our children encounter Shakespeare throughout their educational years and so this early introduction provided by the school is monumental in making his works accessible to young minds. I recall being baffled by the gobbledegook before me, but seeing my son fearlessly reach between the words, discovering the stories and relating to the characters is quite frankly inspiring. Bringing Shakespeare to life this week and taking it off the page embeds this element of learning in a whole new way. It's quite clear to me that you don't really have to know much about Shakespeare to engage with your child's learning, I bet your small person can already teach you something you didn't know...
