







# Year 3 – Spring Term 1 – Fun with Shakespeare

<b>shadows</b>	A shadow is formed when an object blocks out the light. The object must be opaque or translucent to make a shadow.		<input type="checkbox"/> Some objects like glass are transparent which means that light can pass through them.
<b>light source</b>	The main light source for Earth is the Sun. Other sources of light are torches, candles and lamps.		<input type="checkbox"/> Our main source of light on Earth comes from the Sun.
<b>opaque</b>	Opaque objects do not allow light to pass through them.		<input type="checkbox"/> The Sun and other stars, fires, torches and lamps all make their own light and so are examples of sources of light.
<b>transparent</b>	A material that allows light to pass through it.		<input type="checkbox"/> Darkness is the absence of light
