P.E –develop strength and control. Play competitive games and understand how to improve.

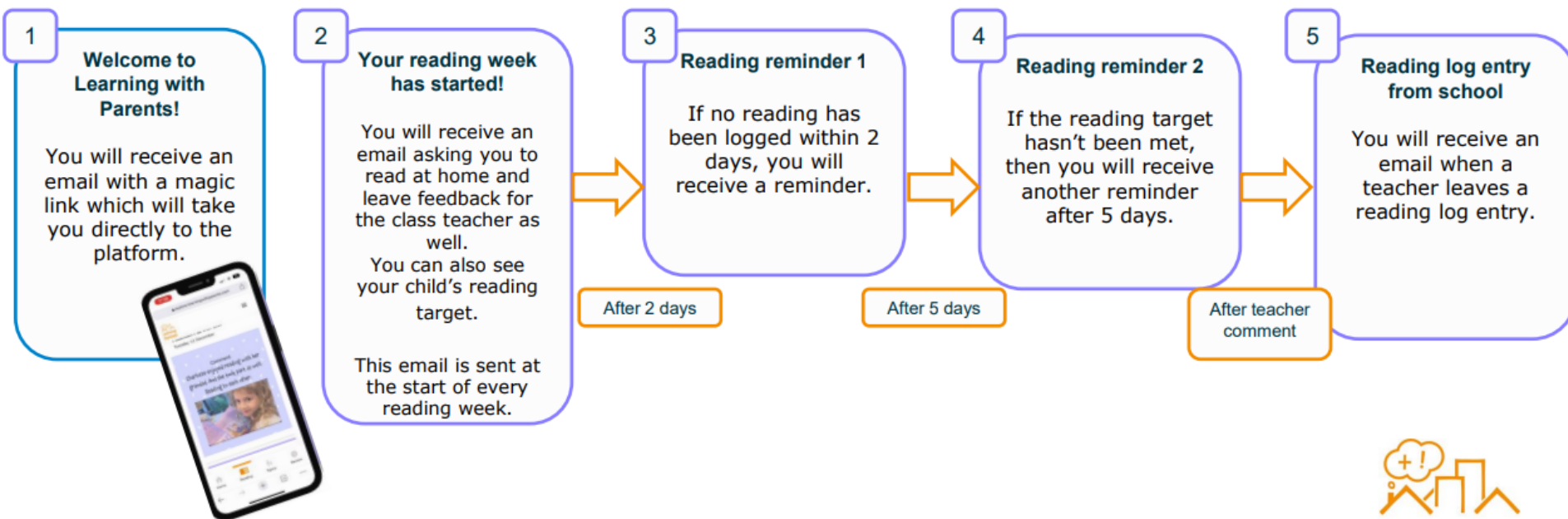
MFL – Continuing from where they are learning now.

- Reading
 - All children are expected to frequently read for pleasure. They will have a library book and an independent reading book. They may also read a range of literature from home. Please read with your child and ask questions about what they are reading.
 - Spellings need to be practised little and often in order to improve fluency and embed their understanding. Spelling lists will be given out half termly. The children will have a spelling test on a Friday.
