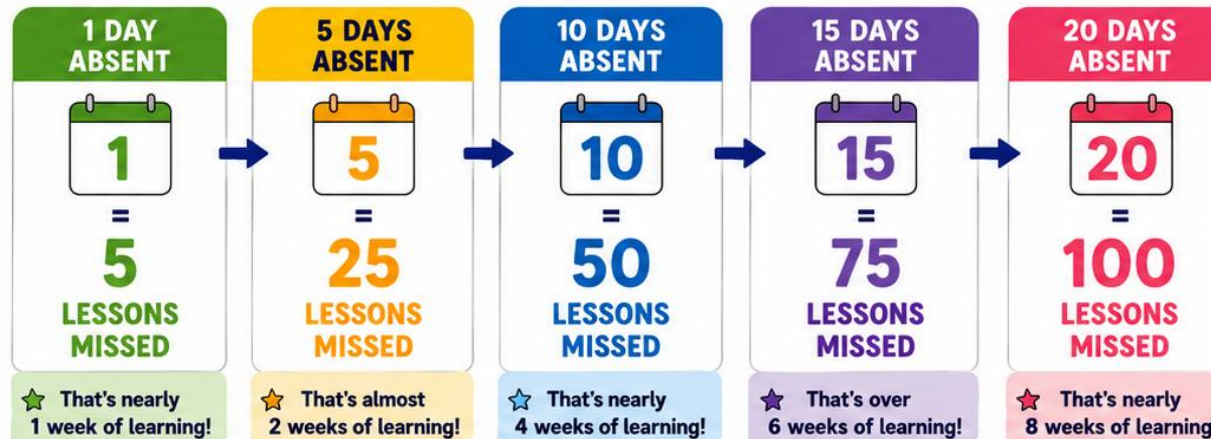

KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE

Research tells us:

- 1 in 5 children experience online bullying.
- Many children see upsetting content online.
- Not every child tells an adult when something worries them.



At Newburgh Primary School we teach children how to stay safe online and encourage them to speak to trusted adults.



OUR MOBILE PHONE EXPECTATIONS

If your child needs to bring a mobile phone to school:



It must be handed into the school office on arrival.



It will be stored safely during the school day.



It will be returned at home time.



Phones and devices must not be used anywhere on the school site.



Phones are not used on educational visits or residential trips.



Children bringing a phone must have parental permission and a signed Mobile Phone Agreement.

PARTNERSHIP WITH PARENTS

Research shows that high screen time outside of school can impact children's wellbeing by reducing time for positive activities like socialising, exercise and getting a good night's sleep.

Newburgh Primary School will work with parents and families to support healthy screen time habits at home.

31% of children aged 8 to 9 have seen something "worrying or nasty" online

Named lunchbox (If packed lunch)

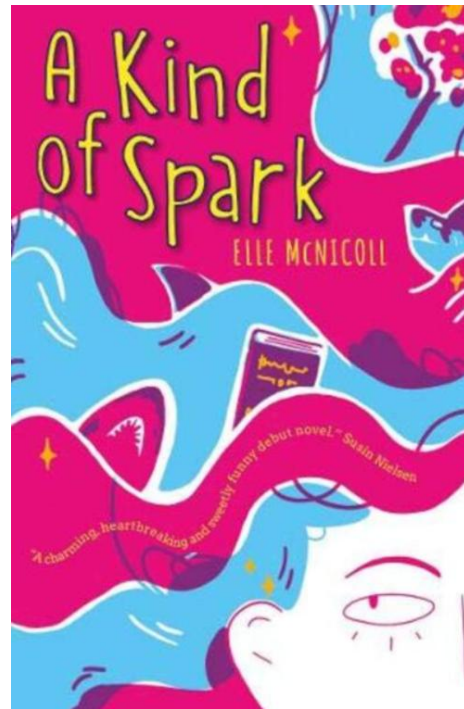
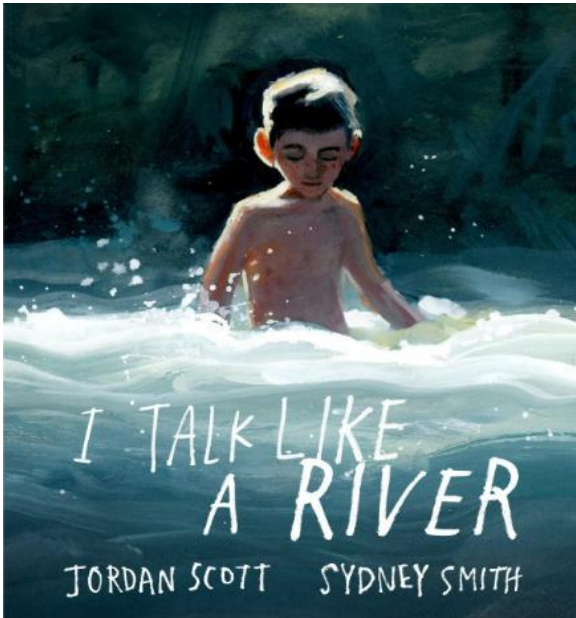

Reading

We are using a digital reading record as this allows the children to develop a love of reading and understand what genre of books they enjoy. The records are to be filled in each time a child reads using the digital reading record. Children receive a house point if they have 3 entries each week.



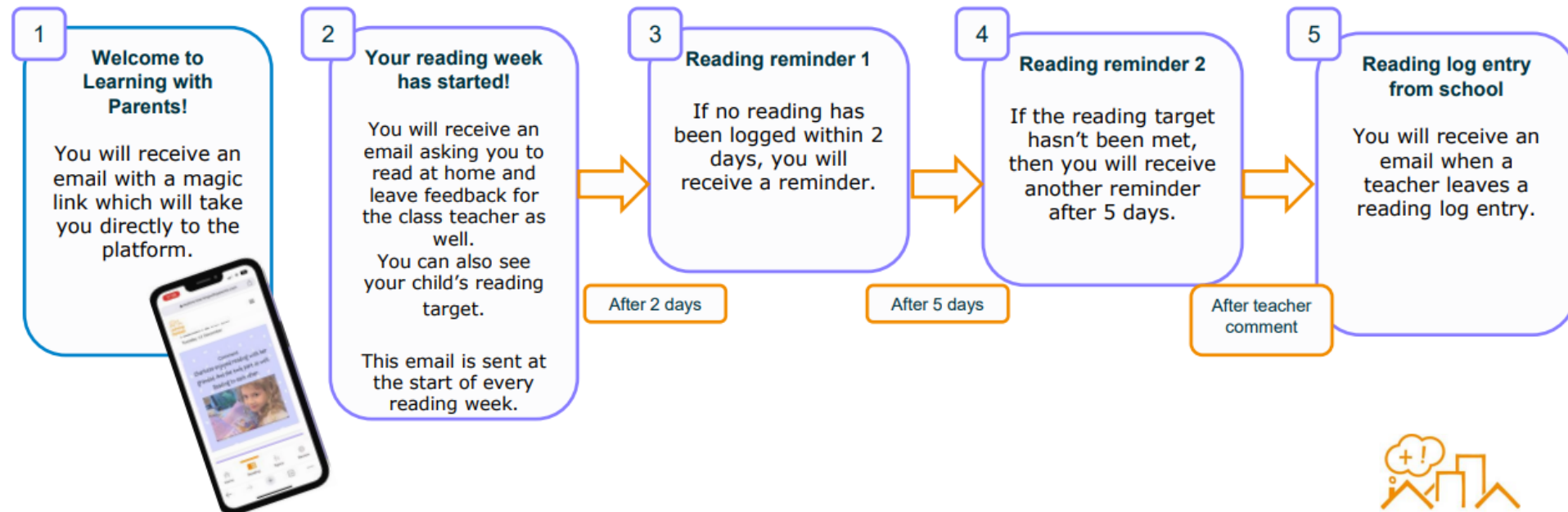
Spelling

On Friday, children will be given a spelling test based around the taught spelling rule. Children will be given 10 spellings to complete during their test. These spellings are sent home at the start of each half term, to allow children to practise their spellings prior to the test.

Maths

Using the TT Rock Stars program children are expected to complete **15 minutes** each week to ensure their fluency of tables and division facts.

The children each week will be set a task to be completed on a maths objective.

Spelling Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG)
