

GOVERNORS CORNER:

October and November are the months of many festivals. Many of you have been celebrating Diwali this week and planning for Halloween or Bonfire night soon after half term.

Diwali legends are well known by now but did you know that Diwali is celebrated exactly 20 days after Dussehra (the day Lord Ram killed Ravana in Sri Lanka).

So the question is why 20 days? If you were to Google the distance between Sri Lanka and Ayodhya (the home of Lord Ram) it shows 2589 km (approx. 1610 miles in 21 days 11hrs) walking.

Now travelling 2589 km in 20 days means travelling on an average of 130 km a day. So lets see if it was possible to travel 130 km (Warwick to Brighton) a day in those times. The fastest way to travel would be on horse.

Assuming they travelled 10 hrs. per day, let us see if you can work out how many km did they travel in one hour.

During half term take this challenge and get out and see how many km can you walk in an hour. Can you match or beat Lord Ram.
